

Vintage Jukeboxes Highlight August 10th Bearrows Auction in Rochelle, Illinois

I bet there aren't too many Illinois auction enthusiasts who haven't been to at least a few of auctioneer John Bearrows' sales in his thirty-plus year history. His firm, Bearrows Real Estate & Auction Company, specializes in farm, estate, and antiques auctions, and is based in the quaint town of Rochelle, Illinois. It's better known as "Hub City" due to the convergence of several highways and railroad lines running right through town. Among them: the Lincoln Highway, the nation's only coast-to-coast highway at the time of its construction.

It's also one of the popular train-watching spots in the Midwest, with an amazing 80 to 120 trains passing through town every day. They even built a special park with elevated viewing platforms, Rochelle Railroad Park, to accommodate the crowds that come from all fifty states and beyond to see them whiz by.

The auction itself took place onsite at the Linnemeier home in Rochelle. And spread out on the lawn was a surprising assortment of collectibles - including large groups of everything from Occupied Japan figurines to Fiesta ware to clocks, furniture, jewelry, and more. The 1960s ranch-style home was unsurprisingly the top-lot

of the day at \$89,000, but the two original-condition jukeboxes did well too, bringing \$2,200 and \$1,800.

Horologists like myself came for a look at the dozen-or-so antique clocks. The winner among them was a classic Ingraham oak calendar regulator that brought \$240; with a German walnut wall clock selling for \$150, and an 8-day American column clock fetching \$190. Another mechanical marvel of note: a mahogany-cased Victrola VV-IX floor phonograph in good original condition that was a good buy at \$160.Other auction highlights ranged from a Pace Jak Pot ten-cent slot machine (\$800), to a nicely restored curved glass oak china cabinet that brought a solid \$600.

Auctioneers for the sale were John Bearrows and 2011 Illinois State Champion Auctioneer Josh Hickey. Bearrows Real Estate & Auction Company has been serving northern Illinois' auction needs since 1991, conducting sales of all kinds. Early Aviation items are always of interest, add the identification & provenance & it was the right mix for a very desirable item. A fine Civil War Maynard Carbine was strong at \$2,640. Weatherby rifles are always good property, especially when they are German manufactured & in rare calibers. A Mark V Varmintmaster in 224 WBY Mag in minty condition demanded \$2,530 & a Mark V in

240 WBY mag was right behind it at \$2,420.

LC Smith doubles are popular within the double gun enthusiast, an a LC Smith

Skeet Special which was a good restoration candidate was still in demand at the sum of \$2,530. Another double followed

that one, this time a rifle. A Sabatti 45-70 cal
Double barreled Rifle was a good buy
at \$2,310. The last of the most interested top
lots went to a rare modern Kel Tec RFB 308 cal Bullpup rifle.

KelTec RFB Bullpup Rifle \$2,090.

Although it is a modern production gun, you may have to wait over a 1yr. from the factory for a new one; these buyers

did not want to wait with a price of \$2,090. Not in the top 25 but still well represented was a Winchester Sewing machine, this rarity stitch right up to \$1,100 & was the top of the Winchester collectibles on this auction.



PAUL BROWN, STAR OF DISCOVERY CHANNEL'S HIT SHOW AUCTION KINGS, IS AVAILABLE FOR APPEARANCES AT ANTIQUE SHOWS, FAIRS AND AUCTIONS

(ATLANTA, Ga.) – Antique show and fair promoters looking to boost attendance at their next event might want to consider booking Paul Brown, the star of The Discovery Channel's hit TV show Auction Kings. Brown has made about a half-dozen appearances at such shows since Auction Kings first began airing in May of 2010, and he found the experiences to be exhilarating.

"I never thought of myself as a celebrity, but the show has elevated my profile and I was approached by some show promoters to appear and meet the public, have photos taken, give informal analysis and appraisal of items and just mix it up with folks in an Auction Kings, is available industry that I love and they love, too," Brown said. for appearances at antique "I'd like to do more of them. Brown, the owner of Gallery 63 in Atlanta, where Auction Kings is filmed, was little known outside the greater Atlanta area prior to the show. But no more. He's recognized now all the time, and not just in his home town. "The power of television is incredible," he said. "My business has tripled since Auction Kings came on the air. It's been a real roller coaster ride."

Even the average price per lot has increased – by a whopping 45 percent – since the show went on the air, simply because of Brown's star power and the intoxicating effect TV must have on bidders. In fact, Brown would be a good fit, too, for auction houses, just like his Gallery 63. Anyone would like to see a 45 percent spike

Brown's star power could easily translate into a successful show or auction for promoters seeking that something extra to draw crowds. Historically, events that feature industry experts, authors, appraisers, or film and TV stars have done better business than shows that didn't feature anyone of note. The booking fees are usually more than offset by a spike in admission revenues.

Brown's high-energy style and playful demeanor are the very qualities that would make him a hit with show-goers. They've been honed over the course of years, warming up crowds first at Red Baron (when he worked for his father, Bob Brown) and later on at Gallery 63 (which he started in 2005). He has an infectious smile and a slightly mischievous way that people like.

At least it has played well to viewing audiences since Auction Kings began its 3? year run. On its website, The Discovery Channel says the show "delves into the world of unique items – from vampire-killing kits to meteorites to jewel-encrusted pencils - and the emotional process of their acquisition and loss." It's made TV stars and celebrities out of Brown and his loyal staff.

But Brown is the undisputed star of the show. Remarkably, it's a gig that almost didn't happen. When Discovery first called him, to see if he'd be interested in the project, he thought it was a crank call. "People come at me all the time, with all kinds of pitches," he said. "I cut them short and told them I wasn't interested." Luckily for him, Discovery wasn't so easily spurned.

A week later, the network phoned again, this time convincing Brown they were serious about featuring him and Gallery 63 in a reality show. Auction Kings follows Brown and his staff Auction Kings, a hit show on as they interact with consignors and customers and explore the wondrous treasures that turn up at the gallery. It has been one of the more popular of the many antiques-related reality TV shows.

Paul Brown may have been born into the antiquing business, but he didn't embrace it early on. He studied literature, earned a bachelor's degree in English and enrolled in graduate school, seemingly on a path to writing, teaching and academia. But as he matured, so did his appreciation of the family business, and in 1989 he went to work for his father at Red Baron's.

Because of his earlier studies, Brown was initially drawn to the academic component of the antiques business. He immersed himself in the catalogs of auction houses like Christie's and Sotheby's, learning the language of the industry. Armed with that, he was able to bring Red Baron's catalogs up to a higher standard. He also handled research, advertising and promotion.

Largely through his efforts, Red Baron's enjoyed enormous success throughout the 1990s and early 2000s. But in 2005, Brown got the itch to branch out on his own, which he did by taking over Gallery 63 in Sandy Springs, a suburb just north of Atlanta (and not too far from Red Baron's). Business was good, until The Discovery Channel came a-knocking, Then it exploded.

As Discovery described his operation, "Paul manages his feisty staff, eager buyers and rare items like a circus under the big top. The bidders and sellers come from all walks of life, looking to make money, buy a unique piece or simply enjoy the excitement of winning. When bidding starts, the gloves come off and it's every buyer for himself." In short – it's an auction.

Now, Paul Brown is offering his style, his wit, his wisdom and his star power to the show promoters and auction houses of America who want an established headliner for their next event. "I've been meeting and greeting the public and working with ground-level dealers for years," he said. "The only difference is, now I'm a celebrity, thanks to the huge success of Auction Kings."




