



Toy Lovers Raise the Prices at Morphy's Auction

"This particular toy was new/old stock with its original box and was found in a toy store in Japan. It's very uncommon to find a Flying

Spaceman in such nice condition, especially with the Superman shield still intact," said Morphy Auctions' owner, Dan Morphy. "There was a lot of interest in the toy prior to our sale, and it didn't surprise me that it went for as much money as it did."

Robots and space toys were strong across the board, Morphy said, with interest from around the world. "I've

never seen online bidding as active as it was for this sale. From start to finish, there were

at least 300 bidders on the Internet at any given time." The auction grossed \$996,000 (all prices quoted in this report are inclusive of 20% buyer's premium).

Although only 8 inches in height, a beautiful Kanto tin wind-up "Television



Kanto Television Robot, tin litho, windup, original box, \$32,400.

Robot" was the object of fierce bidding competition and commanded a price that one might expect of a rare and imposing Gang of Five robot. Together with its richly illustrated factory box, the near-mint extraterrestrial had been entered in the sale with a \$15,000-\$25,000 estimate. Collectors chased the fine example to \$32,400.

Other robot highlights included a boxed tin-litho "Inter Planet Space Captain,"

(est. \$400-\$600) and a boxed Yonezawa battery-operated "Electro

Ray-Gun," \$2,280 (est. \$100-\$300).



Aoshin Shoten Inter Planet Space Captain, tin litho, windup, original box, \$19,800.

A 6-inch Ohio Art sand pail charmed bidders with its early, colorful lithographed image of Minnie Mouse paddling a canoe, along with companions Mickey Mouse and Pluto. Estimated at a modest \$200-\$400, it outperformed all other Disney toys in reaching a final bid of \$4,200.

Cast-iron mechanical banks were in high demand, with a near-mint-plus example of an Artillery Target bank, complete with cannonballs, at the forefront. Although the manufacturer of this particular bank is not known, its designer was Samuel

Clark of Brooklyn, New York, and its patent dates to 1877. Against an estimate of \$18,000-\$25,000, it hit the bull's-eye at \$51,600.


Following closely behind was an 1878 J. & E. Stevens Patronize the Blind Man and His Dog bank. One of the nicest of all known examples, it more than doubled its high estimate to realize \$50,400.

Other banks in the day's top 10 included: an 1891 J. & E. Stevens Cat and Mouse, \$26,400; an 1884 Kyser & Rex Mammy & Child (rare color variation), \$19,200; and an 1878 Pelican with Rabbit made by Trenton Lock and Hardware Co.,

"I was very pleased with the results," said Morphy's owner, Dan Morphy. "There was an atmosphere of enthusiasm throughout the sale, and many new bidders took part from around the world. Ask any auctioneer and they'll tell you there's nothing like new blood to liven up a market. If this sale is any indication of what's to come, 2014 is going to be a very exciting year for us and for the toy



The 20th annual World's Fair Memorabilia Show Returns To Chicagoland

The 1933/34 World's Fair returns to Chicagoland on March 30th. The hours are 10am to 4pm and it is being held at the Elk Grove Holiday Inn, 1000 Busse Road (Rt. 83 and Landmeier Rd.) in Elk Grove Village, Illinois. Admission is \$6, \$5 for seniors over 64. Early 9am Preview admission is \$20.

Collectors and dealers will meet to buy, sell and trade items related to World's Fairs from 1876 to the present. The main focus will be on the 1933/34 Chicago World's Fair. This year our show celebrates the 80th anniversary of the 1934 World's Fair. There will also be items from the 1893 Chicago Columbian Exposition and other Chicago related ephemera. There will be some items from other World's Fairs including: 1904 St. Louis, 1939-40 New York, 1962 Seattle, 1964-65 New York, Expo '67 and most other World's Fairs. There will be over 20 tables of World's Fair items for sale! Though there are few traces left in the area where the fair took place - between Roosevelt Road and 39th Street along the lakefront including the area where Meigs Field was located (now Northerly Island Park) - Rick Rann and Bob Conidi are bringing the fair back to Chicago at this show!

There will be continuous showings of home movies and newsreels on video from the 1933/34 Chicago World's Fair. There will be a special display of 1933 World's Fair memorabilia. World's Fair collectors and fans of the fair are invited to come and relive one of the brightest moments in Chicago's history. Over 39,000,000 people attended Chicago's second World's Fair during 1933 and 1934. (The first being the Columbian Exposition held in 1893.) The theme "A Century of Progress" referred to the one hundred year period from the founding of Chicago in 1833, to the year of the fair, 1933. One of the guiding principles of the fair was "Progress Through Science". Many companies had working factories at the fair, where people could see the products being produced. Some of the items actually produced on the fairgrounds included Firestone tires, White Owl Cigars, Hiram Walker Whiskey (at the 1934 fair, as Prohibition ended at the end of 1933), Wonder Bread, and even Chevrolet automobiles.

The signature attraction of the fair was the Sky Ride. The Sky Ride had two observation platform towers which were 628 feet high (64 stories high). These platforms were taller than any building in Chicago at the time. Visitors could pay 50 cents and either go to the observation deck at the top of the towers (and see up to four states on a clear day) or ride in one of twelve double decked rocket cars at the 219 foot level. Each of the rocket cars held 36 passengers and traveled back and forth over a third of a mile over the fairgrounds.

The fair had many memorable buildings and attractions including the Sky Ride, Havoline's 227 foot tall thermometer tower (with neon tubing showing the current temperatures to fairgoers) and the Travel and Transport Building with a suspended roof. It is amazing that this fair was privately financed at the height of the Depression and was one of the few World's Fairs to make a profit! When the fair's accounts were settled in 1935 the profits were donated to area museums and some of the exhibits from the Fair were moved to area museums.

There are few traces left in the area where the fair took place - between Roosevelt Road and 39th Street along the lakefront including the area where Meigs Field was located (now Northerly Island Park). The Adler Planetarium, the Shedd Aquarium, the Field Museum and Soldier Field all pre-dated the 1933-34 World's Fair, but were incorporated into the plan of the Fair. These landmarks were incorporated into the Museum Campus by Mayor Daley in the 1990s.

They sponsor what will be he 31st annual Badger Knife Show in Janesville, Wisconsin, held this year on March 28, 29 and 30, 2014.

The interest in knife collecting and making is supported by the mission statement of the Badger Knife Club, which is to encourage all aspects in the collecting and making of knives by providing a resource of information on all types of knives, making aware and expressing opinions concerning legislation affecting knives and enhancing the value of collections through expanded knowledge and demand.

The club includes members who are interested and knowledgeable about all types of knives, including: Antique factory made pocket and hunting knives, current production knives, custom made and hand made knives, and tactical and military knives

Red Wing Collectors Society Selects Red Wing Stoneware To Manufacture The Organizations 2014 Annual Commemorative

Red Wing, MN - Red Wing Collectors Society (RWCS) Commemorative Manager Bob Morawski has selected Red Wing Stoneware to manufacture the 2014 RWCS Commemorative. Red Wing Pottery will assist with the manufacturing process and will also turn out cobalt-decorated 2 gallon salt glaze water coolers as the special pieces that will be auctioned off to benefit the Society during the club's annual Convention, July 10-12, 2014.

"I'm excited to work with new owners Bruce and Irene Johnson," Bob says. "Keeping Red Wing Stoneware and Red Wing Pottery alive and in Red Wing is huge for the community, so this is the perfect time to have them create our Commemorative."

The Johnsons purchased Red Wing Stoneware from previous owner Tom Woodruff last November and then bought Red Wing Pottery from Scott Gillmer in December. Red Wing Pottery was owned by the Gillmer family ever since former Red Wing Potteries President Richard Gillmer bought out the company's assets after the Potteries closed in 1967.

"The Johnson's passion and vision for Red Wing Stoneware and Red Wing Pottery will benefit the RWCS organization, the membership, the community of Red Wing, and so many more," adds Stacy Wegner, RWCS executive director. "We can't wait for Convention to see it all in motion."

Morawski says this will be only the second time in RWCS history that the Commemorative is produced in Red Wing; the Johnsons hope it is the first in a long line of pieces that they make for the club.

"We want to build a long-term relationship with the Society by creating a high-quality Commemorative that's on time and on budget," Irene says. "We're also going to do everything we can to promote the club, because the Society's success directly impacts us."

"We strongly feel that working with the Collectors Society will enhance the club's growth just as it will ours," Bruce adds. "We include a company flyer with every product that we ship out, and we see a lot of benefit in including information about the Society, as well. Making customers aware of the club's existence can only increase their interest in pottery and stoneware, which is good for all of us."

The identity of the RWCS Commemorative is a closely guarded secret every year until the piece is unveiled on the Thursday of Convention Week (July 10). But something that isn't a secret is the activities and events the Johnsons have in store for all the RWCS members who will visit Red Wing this July.

First, the popular factory tours will continue at Red Wing Stoneware and the Johnsons found a lot of unique pieces when cleaning out storage space, which they plan to sell during Convention Week.

As for the Red Wing Pottery Salesroom, the Johnsons are remodeling the interior and exterior to give it more of a "stoneware and pottery look and feel". The candy shop will reopen soon along with the Salesroom, but a coffee shop will also be incorporated into the space by the time Convention rolls around in early July. The

Loons and Lady Slippers gift shop will reopen around May 1.

"We're going to have a lot going on at both sites during Convention Week," Bruce says. "We'll use this time to unveil our companies' annual commemorative and perhaps our annual Christmas ornament. In addition, we'd like to set up an area in the Pottery Salesroom to serve as an Antique Roadshow for people to bring in their Red Wing items and chat with Red Wing Collector Society members about it's history and value. We will also have some activities going on in the parking lot."

The Johnsons also plan to open a pottery classroom at the Pottery Salesroom so customers can try their hand at making their own pieces after watching the potters at work as well as provide community education classes.

"We've noticed during the factory tours at Red Wing Stoneware that people really enjoy watching the potters hand-turn pieces, and they will often buy a finished example of a piece they watched being made because they're amazed by all the skill and patience that goes into creating it," Irene explains. "We're going to carry that over to the Pottery by giving visitors the chance to try it for themselves."

Florida - The Asheford Institute of Antiques (AIA), a professional-level distance learning program on antiques, collectibles and appraising???, announced at an industry trade gathering recently that it plans to open new offices in Beijing, China by 2016,

that will coincide with the school's 50th anniversary that same year.

During a publicly issued press statement at the event, the Institute's Director, Charles Green, was quoted as saying that, "The growing demand for Asian antiques, both here and abroad, made the decision to expand in that direction relatively easy, especially when you consider the sheer numbers involved." Insiders at the school emphasized that industry research they had conducted, had

shown that people, regardless of geography, were hungry for as much new information on Asian antiques as they could get - especially items coming from China.

School spokesperson, Anthony Drew, said the Institute had been contacted by a number of antique concerns in the region who were interested in a joint venture that would allow for the expansion of the Asheford curriculum to China as well as neighboring countries. Drew went on to say that with a burgeoning middle-class developing throughout these areas, the time was now ripe to bring Asheford-style instruction in the field of antiques and appraising to the far east. "After that, it was just a matter of partnering with someone we really believed could help blend our program on antiques, collectibles and appraising with someone from that region of the globe," said Drew. "It's a different world over there, and you have to be mindful of how things operate, so we wanted to proceed cautiously."

When asked about curriculum changes involved in rolling out the Asheford program in China, Drew said that the Asian Course will be designed for an entirely different demographic, "It will be based on the items, products and services that are readily available to the people of this region at the time."

Release dates for the Asian Course are expected to coincide with the opening of the Beijing offices, and the school's 50th anniversary celebration sometime in 2016.
