



Surprising Finds at the Thirty-Ninth Annual WADA Winter Antiques Show

It's now been thirty-nine years that the Wisconsin Antique Dealers Association has been putting on this winter-edition antiques show. That's quite an accomplishment in itself, but you have to remember that this show is a relative newcomer to the WADA show schedule. The original WADA Fall Antiques Show will be celebrating its sixtysecond anniversary later this Year! There can't be too many other antiques associations around that can make that claim.

And in those six decades, WADA has done much more than just hold antiques shows. As a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving the State's past heritage, WADA has a long history of providing grants to historical and heritage societies throughout the State, including the Friends of the Wisconsin Historical Society. This year's WADA Grant to the Friends will be used to fund restoration of artifacts at Lake Geneva's Black Point Estate, the 1880s retreat of prominent Chicago brewer Conrad Seipp.

WADA is also continuing its founding sponsorship of the "30th Star Benefit Antiques Auction," a biennial fund raiser held at the Wisconsin Historical Society's Old World Wisconsin Historic Site. And while the next "30th Star" auction is still a year away; donations of vintage and antique items are already being accepted. Just give Riene (262-363-4700) or Debbie (815-575-1272) a call for all the details, or visit www.friendswisconsinhistory.org.

All of the WADA shows are held at the Waukesha Expo Center, just a short drive west of Milwaukee. It's a great show site - right off the interstate, with lots of free parking. Inside, the dealers can spread out among the three well-lit adjacent halls of the Forum Building. It's those dealers, of course, that are the reason that folks have been coming to the WADA shows for so long. And with more than fifty-five dealers

at both the fall and winter editions of the event, you're almost sure to find something to love.

And while the WADA Show is best known for classic Americana, you'll now find purveyors here with everything from fine estate jewelry to vintage toys and advertising. Like at Yesterday's Memories, whose booth was filled with, well, pretty much anything you could imagine. My favorite there: a tiny Merriplay salesman's sample swing set, asking price \$395. Or at Ugly Rick's Collections, where the inventory ranged from early pressed steel trucks to a choice group of soda fountain syrup dispensers.


Fine art more your thing? There was much to choose from all over the show, from a western landscape by Taos, New Mexico artist Ralph Goltry (at Antiques, Art & Treasures, \$2,400) to the swinging '60s portrait of a young woman I found at Hunters Lake Antiques - a watercolor by noted Milwaukee artist Karl Priebe.

The fine art display at Ron Christman Antiques & Art never disappoints either, with a focus on works by Wisconsin and regional artists. From all-original vintage lighting at Aladdin Lamps to art glass of every era at Jeff Durst Antiques, you're going to find it here in quantity, and more importantly, quality.

I look forward to every WADA Antiques Show. Each dealer has something different to offer, whether it's that special antique you've been hunting for, an impromptu history lesson, or stories of the treasures they've found (and lost) over the years. If you missed this show, be sure to mark your calendar with the dates of the fall edition of the WADA Show. It also takes place right here at the Waukesha Expo Center, on the first weekend in October. For 2013, that would be October 4th and 5th. 



The history includes two factories, a devastating fire, the sale of the company to International Multifoods of Minnesota, and ultimately, the sale to Hagen-Renaker, a well-known California Pottery, in 1980.

Nancy Kelly has been a California Pottery collector for many years, and has enjoyed meeting the wonderful people responsible for creating these amazing items. To have the privilege of researching and writing about them has been a dream come true.

From Toys to Advertising to Petroliana at Matthews 3 Day Auction in Raymond, IL

The three-day event was held Feb. 15-17, in Raymond, at the gallery of Pope Auction Center.

The sale was conducted at the gallery of Pope Auction Center in Raymond, with whom Matthews Auctions often partners. Headlining the event was an exceptional group of antique toys and signs from the Joe Russell estate out of New York City. The toys in particular were of high quality and in excellent condition. A smaller New York toy collection was also offered.

The Feb. 15-16 sessions also featured many fine advertising and petroliana (gas station) signs - categories for which Matthews Auctions has become renowned in the industry over the years. But on

Feb. 17, decorative arts took center stage. These consisted mainly of art pottery, early American pattern glass, Pickard china and other items. The portrait vase was in this group.

"Day three was a bit of a departure for us, and it may have taken some folks by surprise that we were offering decorative arts at all," said Dan Matthews of Matthews Auctions. "But the items were very well received, and I want this to be a signal that we're more than just gas station collectibles and advertising signs. That's still our bread and butter but now we're branching out."

Around 70 people attended the auction live, while another 450 registered to bid online, through Proxibid. Many absentee bids were fielded, to go with a handful of phone bids.



Another portrait vase also did well in the Feb. 17 decorative arts session. That one was a Roseville Rozane vase, 14 1/2 inches in height, showing a man wearing a hat and artist signed "A. Williams." Like its cocker spaniel counterpart, this example was in great shape, with no chips, cracks or repairs. It was marked "Rozane RPCo" on the bottom and changed hands for \$1,265.

Two pump plate signs took place and show honors for the auction. The first was a Husky Tri-Power porcelain pump plate sign with dog graphics, 12 inches by 12 inches, rated 8.9 out of 10 for condition, with strong gloss (\$2,310). The other was a Pacer 400 porcelain pump plate sign with ethyl logo, 14 inches by 9 inches, with great color and gloss, rated a robust 9 (\$1,815).

Two other lots managed to top the \$1,000 mark. One was a Zerolene ("The Standard Oil for Motor Cars") single-sided porcelain sign, 6 inches in diameter, with fabulous color and gloss, rated 8.9 and showing only minor wear in the mounting holes (\$1,045). Florida – The old saying that every season has a reason, seems to be spot on when it comes to people looking to purchase antiques and collectibles. The Asheford Institute of



Antiques (AIA), a professional-level, distance learning program on antiques and appraising, recently released the results of an in depth survey it conducted on market trends in the antique business, which it compiled from students and former graduates.

The primary focus of the survey was to gauge interest in current trends of antiques and collectibles, based on sales and requests for particular items. And while no measurable scientific practices were employed, and the survey was informal in nature, the

results were still quite interesting, said the schools publications Director, Tony Drew. "What we found was that there was a real generational shift in the marketplace, things that tended to "trend" upwards in a truly noticeable fashion, were much more the domain of younger buyers. Whereas items that seemed to have little or no Internet "buzz," remained fairly stable in their position of relative interest to potential customers, and were more often purchased buy older buyers." In other words, said Drew, "Younger consumers seemed to be setting the trends as to what was hot and what was not – some what unusual occurrence in the world of antiques."

Don Kirpatrick, a 20-something dealer in the Northeast who participated in the school survey, said that while he still looks at everything when attending auctions for inventory, he now concentrates more heavily on items like Art Deco, and early primitives. "My clientele is primarily younger-hipster folks who want things from these periods, they're not looking for mid-Victorian pieces that are heavily decorated..." Staffers from the school who conducted the survey said this was a common theme they found when asking about what was selling. "Younger dealers had very different items and inventory when compared to older dealers," said Shirley Huey, one of the staffers who helped complete the survey, "Not only were they different in inventory, but in their marketing approaches as well."

Charles Green, current Director of the Institute, also noted that while 20 years ago most antiques stores often had a "little bit of everything," today's dealers tend to concentrate on items based on generational interest. "I think what we're finding, said Green, "is that bricks and mortar antique businesses are beginning to be more representative of what you see in online stores... a far greater degree of specialization is taking place, and the age of both the dealer and the customer seems to have something to do with that."

Green went on to stress that while the survey was by no means scientific, it still pointed out interesting trends within the today's antiques marketplace.




