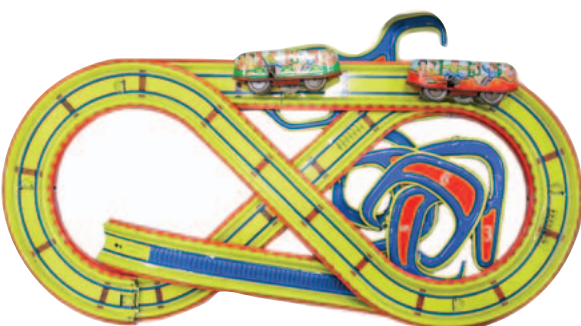
The Oregon Woman's Club Antiques Show - A Northern Illinois Tradition for Three Generations

The beautiful Blackhawk Center in Oregon, Illinois hosted the Sixty-Third Annual Oregon Women's Club Antiques Show on March 23rd and 24th. And after more than three generations hosting the venerable event, the show is bigger and better than ever. Around fifty dealers, some of who you won't see anywhere else, filled the hall with an interesting mix of antiques and collectibles from the 18th century onwards. And all of the show's proceeds go back into the community, supporting the local food bank, student scholarships, and more.

Blackhawk Center Hosts Sixty-Third Annual Oregon, Illinois Woman's Club Antiques Show

If you're coming to the little town of Oregon, Illinois from the north, be sure to take Route 2 - it's one of the most scenic drives in the northern part of the state. The road follows the meandering Rock River from Rockford, through the little town of Byron, and on to Oregon.

And just north of Oregon at Lowden State Park, look across the river, and you'll see the majestic image of a Native American gazing over the Rock River Valley. This is no ordinary statue. It's a fifty-foot-tall reinforced concrete wonder that is awe-inspiring. The figure weighs more than half a million pounds, and is said to be the second largest monolithic concrete statue in the world. Sculptor Lorado Taft designed the statue as a tribute to all Native Americans, but it's more commonly associated with Chief Black Hawk.

And whether you're antiquing or not, Oregon, Illinois is worth a look. Just twenty-seven miles south of Rockford and ninety miles west of Chicago, it's often referred to as "the prettiest small town in America." The tree-lined streets are populated with picturesque Victorian homes, and in the center of downtown sits the venerable Ogle County Courthouse. Other Historical attractions abound in the area, including the nearby John Deere Historical Site - where Deere invented the self-polishing steel plow that that opened the prairie to agriculture.

The modern Blackhawk Center, just west of downtown Oregon, is host to the sixty-three year-old Oregon Women's Club Antiques Show. The multi-use facility, a joint effort of the local school & park districts, is a terrific venue for the show, and quite an accomplishment for this town of just over 4,000.

There were around fifty dealers set up at the show, coming from several Midwest states and beyond. And don't be fooled by the show's small-town location: you'll find quality antiques here, the dealers drawn by attendance that often exceeds that of the "big city" shows. Of course, the event is a mainstay for many Illinois dealers, including Vye's Antiques. They brought a wide assortment of American artifacts ranging from an early pair of wood & iron ice skates to a hard-to-find Rollmonica - best described as a cross between a harmonica and a player piano.

Country Americana is always the theme at Robinson Ridge Antiques. My favorite there: a well-worn mail sorting desk from central Illinois, price tag only \$485. More exceptional American country furnishings sat nearby in the display of Country at Heart, from decorated stoneware galore to an early 19th century Maine step-back cupboard in old red paint, asking price \$1,350.

In fact, you'll find dealers here specializing in everything from Victorian art glass and vintage jewelry to toys, pottery, advertising, and more. Just take a look at the photos and you'll see what the show's all about.

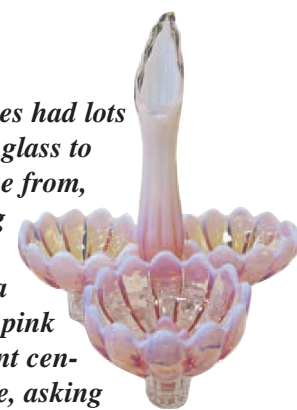
Thanks to Oregon Women's Club for inviting me to the event. They said not to forget to mention the fantastic job that show manager Ron Bry did promoting the sixty-third edition of the event, attracting many new dealers to the show, and many new shoppers too. It's an important event for the Woman's Club. Each year the show brings in the lion's share of the funds used throughout the year to benefit the community. 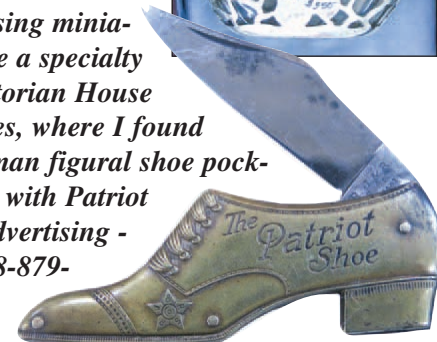

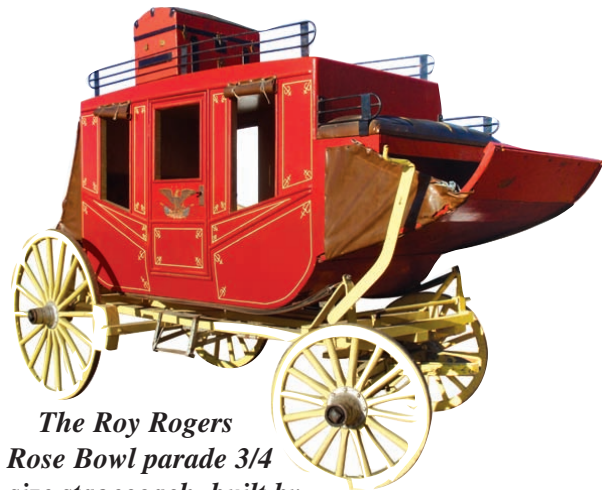
