The Rich Penn May Auction Event was billed as 4 "Rack 'em, Sack 'em & Rock 'em" and they did all of that! The two day auction event held in Des Moines, IA on May 3rd & 4th brought Billiard, Country Store and Rock & Roll collectors from across the country. Those in-house bidders competed fiercely with 2,000 online bidders from nearly 40 countries across the globe and the majority of pieces sold to in-house bidders. When the auction opened at 9:00 AM, Rich Penn thanked all those in attendance for making the trip to Des Moines, which was precarious for many. According to Penn, "This is the first time our spring auction, in early May was greeted with 5" of snow, but this is Iowa. So if you don't like the weather, wait 15 minutes and it'll be something different!" He was correct, the balance of the weekend warmed up and ended up being quite nice.



Billiard, Country Store & Rock-n-Roll Collectors Flocked to Rich Penn's Incredible 2 Day Auction

According to Penn, "Quality and condition are still bringing strong prices and the market seems to be picking up strength." His comments were supported by examples throughout the auction. Saturday's session largely included the Phil Norton Country Store Collection, from Ohio. Phil attended the auction with his two granddaughters and all three seemed to enjoy the excitement.

The top lot in the Saturday session was the Montelaise Vigorola Syrup dispenser. Penn told the audience, "We've sold hundreds of syrup dispensers and this one is the most pristine dispenser we've ever sold. It looks like it was never used." The dispenser ended up bringing a \$6,750 price. These reported prices do not include the 10% to 20% buyer's premium. Spice tins were also popular in the auction and Norton and hundreds of them. Many commanded "Spicy" prices too! One lot of five, including Dandy-Line by Colter, Sunset Gold by Piggly-Wiggly & Burke's by Burke Grocery Co.-Cinc, shook out a top bid of \$1,000. Two other lots, A Daisy Dell Brand Allspice and a Foltz Maid Cloves

each sold for \$850. But the top spice lot was the rare Dove Brand 5 drawer oak spice cabinet from the Frank Tea & Spice Co., Cincinnati, OH. It brought a tasty \$3,500 top bid.

From spices to razors...the interest held up. Small things continued to bring big prices. A small, 7" x 7" counter top display for Tree Brand Razors, sliced off a big bid of \$2,700. The display, from H. Boker & Co. came with a selection of six miscellaneous celluloid straight razors. Advertising collectors all appreciated the beautiful lithography in the two excellent condition stone lithos for Cascarets Candy Cathartic. The large paper signs, 28" x 41" commanded an impressive \$2,300 and \$2,250.

The variety at Penn's auction kept bidders interested and there were significant pieces throughout the auction. One of the pieces was the Willimantic Linen Exposition Spool cabinet. The impressive display features a towering structure of spool thread in the form of a building. It likely was made for the Philadelphia or Columbian expos. The piece quickly attracted a winning bid of \$2,200. Another piece that sold at that \$2,200 price was the coin-operated Blackhawk Brand aspirin vendor. In excellent original condition, the machine came nearly full of original tiny canisters containing aspirins. Also selling at the \$2,200 price...but much larger, was the 12' long oak Sherer seed counter. Correct, with all it's signed pulls and appropriate transfers & tags, it will make a keystone piece to any country store collection. Petroliana collectors were pumped with excitement when a rare ripple glass Mobilgas globe crossed the block. With two glass panels showing the iconic Pegasus logo, and even a small crack in the collar, the globe still metered a \$2,100 top bid.

Even though the Saturday session featured 600 lots, guest auctioneer Fred VanMetre kept the pace throughout and finished the session in late afternoon. Sunday's session was shorter, with just over 400 lots and began promptly at 9:00.

Sunday's session featured the billiard collection of Dave Laney and the Rock & Roll collection of Sarah & Ryan King. And things did "rock" with the billiard pieces racking up top bids. With dozens of classic Brunswick pieces, midway through the Sunday session came the very rare J.M. Brunswick & Balke "Nonpareil" cue rack, With all it's original lettering, it attracted both strong in-house and internet bidding. The successful in-house bidder came from California and took the rack home for \$10,000. Another rare Brunswick cue rack was the elegant rotary, in ebonized cherry wood with gold gilding, it spun up quickly to an equally elegant top bid of \$8,500.

Decorative billiard pieces did well too. A framed souvenir poster from the 1883 World Championship Billiard Match in Chicago, shot straight to a winning bid of \$5,000. A reverse paint on glass sign for the Metropolitan Billiard Hall sold at

\$4,000. Two framed Brunswick "Billiard Experts of the World" posters, in the red and green versions, sold for \$2,800 and \$2,500 respectively. For those ready to shoot a classic game of billiards, the Brunswick Emanuel heavily inlaid table sold at \$4,500. An equally striking pair of ornately carved spectator chairs sold for nearly as much at \$4,000.

With Rock & Roll pieces mixed in, the Sunday session had an interesting harmony! One of everyone's favorite pieces had an age difference of about 100 years and five generations from the pieces in the billiard collection. Both collections reflecting the main pastimes of the young in their respective generations. So it wasn't surprising that the 1979 Bally "Kiss" pinball machine played well for a winning bid of \$2,300. A collectable set of four posable Kiss "action" figures, in their original boxes, walked up to a top bid of \$600. A set of composition Kiss heads, each one autographed, sold for \$500. A signed Frank Zappa concert contract brought \$400 and a Beatles third state Butcher

album brought \$475. Another album, c.1971, Led Zeppelin IV, with all four band member autographs, sold to a Zeppelin fan for \$850. Everyone wondered about the Gibson Les Paul guitar. In it's original case, it strummed it's way up to a respectable \$750 bid. But one of the more surprising lots in the auction was at the end of the session. Lot #1034 had six comic books, including three early "Golden Age" comics. They were a World's Finest No. 14 with Superman & Batman, a Detective Comics No. 65 with Batman & Robin and an Action Comics No. 16, with Superman. The lot of six exploded to a top bid of \$800 in an instant. Again...another reflection of the favorite pastime of several generations removed. Penn concluded, "All in all this was a fun and successful auction. We offered collections that spanned over a hundred years and there was solid interest across the timeline. What fun it was to watch the bidders, younger and older!"

Penn's next auction is the weekend of November 1, 2 & 3, 2013 and will also be in Des Moines, IA. According to Penn, the three days will feature billiard pieces from the collection of the late Steve Keesey of Pennsylvania, the Coca-Cola collection of the late Chuck Hardy from Iowa, several country store collections, drug store and soda fountain items, coin operated machines and a variety of other unusual pieces. "I've been on the road setting up at shows for nearly two weeks," said Dan Davis from Reno, Nev., adding "It'll be good to go home after Kalamazoo."

Davis wowed the crowds with a 14-inch-long Dolling Mercury gas-powered 1920s race car offered for \$3,500. Folks "oohed and ahhed" over his pressed steel Buddy L sprinkler truck, priced at \$2,800.

Still another Buddy L toy, a 20-inch-long restored Shell gas truck, could be enjoyed at your home for \$800. It was shown by Roy Cassatta of Forest Park, Ill. At the same spot, a two-piece tin 1932 Wyandotte Circus truck and trailer was priced at \$1,200.

Promotional car collectors swooped down on the booth of Bob Cline, Woodstock, Ill., for his selection of 160 examples, many from his personal collection.
