For many antique dealers setting up at the June 9 show at the LaPorte County Fairgrounds in LaPorte, Indiana, it is a return trip that they started 16 years ago – and continues to 2013. Many shoppers over the years have taken home finely refinished furniture from 16-year veteran dealers Marvin and Connie Novak of nearby Michigan City, Indiana.

At the June event the couple showed off more high quality items including a 4-foot-long 54-inch-tall double-door birch bookcase priced at \$395. Shoppers also checked out a 62-inch-long 67-inch-tall pine kitchen cupboard tagged at \$525.

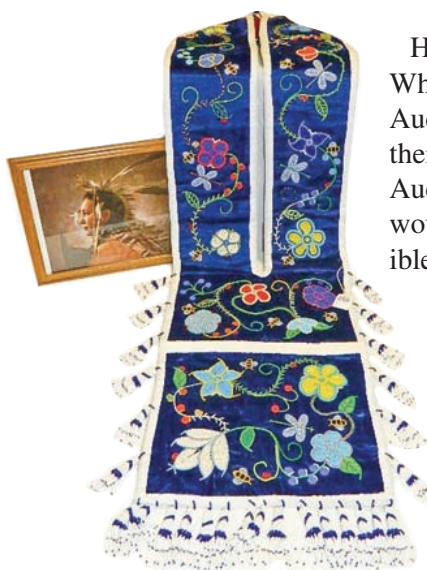
From Primitives to Tiffany and Much More at Tumbleson Three-Day Auction in Princeton, IL

Three Days of Excitement at Tumbleson Memorial Day Weekend Auction

Day-one featured hundreds of antique tractor seats, plus other country and primitive pieces. Sunday saw everything from high-end art glass to Victorian furniture cross the block – and some choice collector cars. And sporting collectors were all here for Monday's finale, with more than one-hundred period decoys by makers of the likes of Walker and Elliston, plus large groups of period firearms and Native American artifacts.

TT Tumbleson Auction Company conducts close to one-hundred auctions each year, but has become famous for their multi-day holiday sales. Pretty much pick a major holiday and Tumbleson Auction will be having a two or three-day auction. Princeton, Illinois might sound far away, but it's actually just a two-hour drive from Madison, Chicago, or Dubuque. The Tumbleson Auction Gallery is just a few blocks off of Interstate 80 in north-central Illinois.

They don't actually have an auction gallery - they have two. On big weekend events like this one, auction-goers have an opportunity to preview the next day's auction already set up in the adjoining climate-controlled twin halls; a big plus for both buyers and sellers alike.

Most of the items in the auction were from several local estates, and believe me; they needed three days to sell the 2,000-plus lots. Saturday, day-one of the sale, was devoted to a huge antique tractor seat collection, as well as stoneware and primitives of all sorts. I attended Sunday's sale, which offered the full-house crowd a wide array of quality antiques - from art glass and pottery to Victorian furniture to some choice period lighting. Antique furniture did well, with several pieces making \$400 or more, with contemporary furniture doing better still. China sets proved popular too, with a mixed group of flow blue making a total of \$890, and a Lenox Autumn service for twenty-one right behind at \$850. Other Saturday notables: several sets of Sterling flatware, bringing up to \$1,450; and a rectangular Buffalo Pottery tray that fetched \$450.

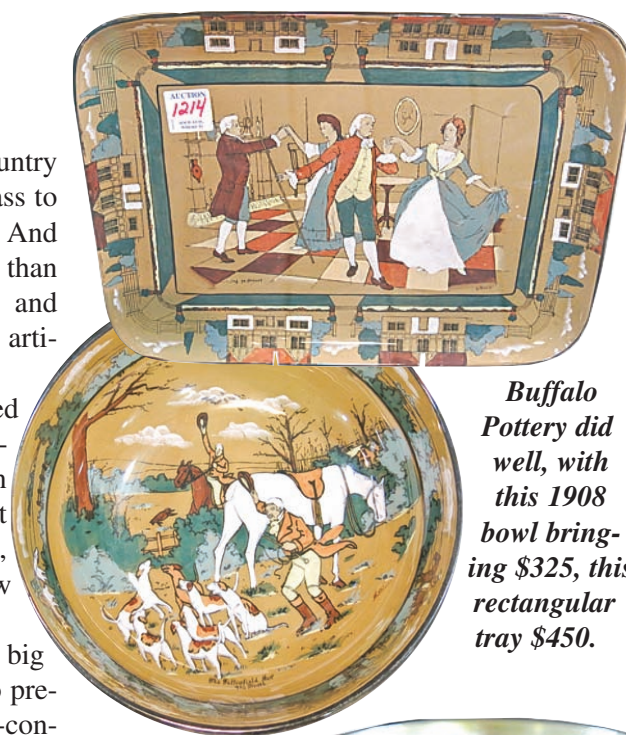
Things couldn't have looked more different than on Monday – day-three of the sale. A sea of vintage decoys filled dozens of tables; many of them coveted Illinois River birds. Of them, a Charles Walker mallard drake was the winner price-wise at \$2,300, with a Robert Elliston bluebill bringing \$1,200. A crudely-repainted Charles Perdue mallard pair still managed \$900, as did a Mason Premier green-wing teal drake in good original paint.

Tumbleson Auction has built up quite a loyal following in their thirty-plus years of operation: it was a full house all weekend, with a crowd of both local folks and collectors from several states. Tom, Mary, and second-generation bid-caller Tiffany Foes are fast and friendly auctioneers. Each sell at close to one-hundred & forty lots per hour, so grab a catalog, find a seat, and be sure to keep your bid card handy!

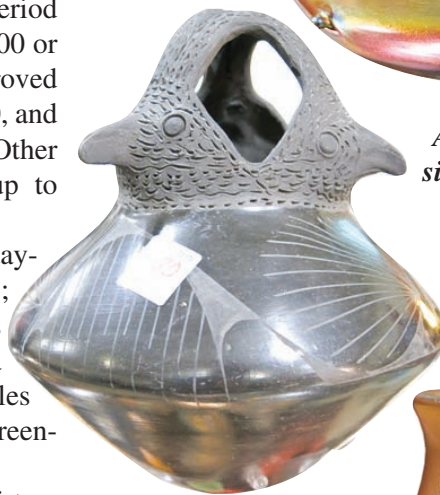

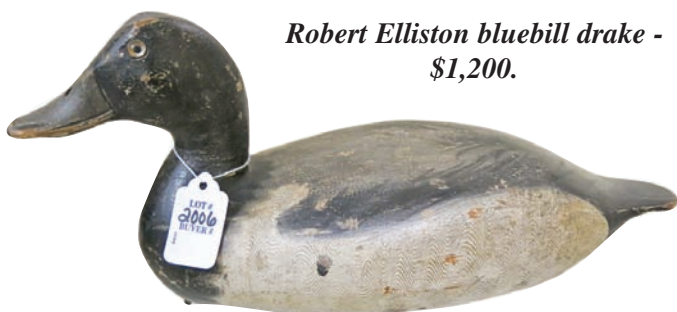

Quality Items Bring Buyers to LaPorte, Indiana

Debra Honeycutt, who hosts a booth at Harbert Antique Mall in Harbert, Mich., is another "charter" dealer. Drawing attention at her booth at the LaPorte show was a pair of elaborate 1890s steam indicators with oak carry cases and original paper instructions showing how to test steam engines. Buyers had their choice at \$100 each.

Camera collectors have been visiting the booth of Larry Sipes of Lafayette, Ind., for all those 16 years for his fine selection of photo-related items. This time a 1950s Ed Sullivan Kodak film tin advertising display could be taken home for \$99, while an 1890s "Laterna" tin film projector, complete with folding wood case and six slides could entertain you for \$199.

"We've never missed a show," said Herschel Relford, who with wife Betty sets up bringing items from Rolling Prairie, Ind. Relford showed off many outdoorsman items and was especially proud of a 1960s Old West style "fast draw" .45 pistol, holster and belt made by Hahn. "I know it works," said Relford, adding "I shot it myself." The BB-firing CO2 replica of old cowboy days could be used for target practice for \$145.

"We've been here since the beginning," said Frank Gorski who displays antiques with wife Alice from Hobart, Ind. Shoppers were busy snapping up his selection of vintage cardboard shotgun shell boxes offered for \$30 each while other sportsmen eyed an Ambassador fishing reel, complete with original leather case

priced at \$85.

"I'm a 16-year show dealer," said Elizabeth Ridenour, who also hosts a booth at Coachman Antique Mall, downtown LaPorte. She smiled as she pointed out a 1780 to 1820 "peg lamp" that was said to transition between candles and oil. The unusual 20-inch-tall brass and cut glass piece was priced at \$120.

Another collectable lamp was shown by another Laporte Show lifer Charlotte Slabaugh of Bourbon, Ind. The colorful Arts and Crafts period clay base parchment shade 12-inch-tall lamp could "light up your life" for \$65.

Show promoter Mary Mitri said she was, "proud of all the dealers, especially the veterans," and looked forward to working to boost dealer and visitor counts for the summertime event. She said the show promotions included billboards, local radio and newspaper advertising, multiple ads in Auction Action Antique News along with 7,000 flyers.

Moderate temperatures greeted shoppers streaming onto the fairgrounds Sunday morning, but if warmer weather occurs, the show boasts two of the inside buildings featuring air conditioning, an unusual plus for a fairgrounds venue.

LaPorte shoppers and dealers get a summertime break as the next shows are not scheduled until Sept. 8 and Oct. 13. The promoters also host a two-day event at the Porter County Expo in Valparaiso, Ind., on Nov. 2 and 3.

Why Join a Collecting Club?

If you pick up membership promotion brochures from clubs, or visit collecting club websites, you are confronted with all kinds of statements about why collectors should join this club or that one.

"A serious collector is an educated collector and you can become an educated collector by joining our club." "A great way to become 'connected' for buying, selling or trading." "To meet other collectors and develop friendships which can last a lifetime." "To gain knowledge on values, reproductions and how to care for my collection."

These are all very valid reasons to join a collecting club... and, there are dozens more, we're sure. Some clubs do a tremendous job with membership services, offering newsletters and publications, mentoring programs, an educational website, annual convention, shows and auctions, price guides and research projects, resource libraries and archives, collector insurance programs, reproduction alerts, ethics guidelines for both collectors and dealers, member supply stores, annual membership collectors items and much more.

In reviewing what clubs offer and their various membership dues structures, it seems to us that membership in most clubs is a real bargain - a year's worth of service often for about the same price you would pay to go to a movie (with popcorn and drink), or a sports event or concert (and often a lot less).

Another factor to consider is that for most clubs we are talking about a one year commitment. Membership dues is usually for 12 months. At that time you can either renew for another year or decide not to.

Even for a person who is just beginning and maybe only mildly interested in a collecting area, what better way to determine if you want to become more serious in that collecting area than having a year's worth of member services from the club supporting that collecting area to help you "weigh your decision"?

For the collector who may possibly be interested in four or five different collecting areas, we would strongly suggest consider joining the clubs which support each of these four or five collecting areas. OK, so maybe you're not that much of a joiner. It still is the most practical way of letting the collecting club sell you on which area to eventually collect more seriously through the simple technique of comparison shopping. Let the clubs sell you on collecting in their area.

Another option, without the obligation of actively paying membership dues, is to simply ask a collecting club you may be interested in to send you some information on their club and the collecting area they support.

This is the main thrust of the Association of Collecting Clubs' Join A Club program - promoting the ACC Club Directory and the listings of over 6,000 collecting groups... probably some you've never heard of before, and how to contact them.

Now, getting back to the original question, "Why join a collecting club?" Probably the best answer is because YOU want to. It has to be your decision. Like your collection, itself, it's a personal thing. You decide what to collect... what to buy... how to display it... and everything else connected with your collecting. Joining, or not joining, a collecting club is a part of this. Most collecting clubs exist to support and help collectors, and perform a good service for their collecting area. But they also have the obligation of convincing you that you should join their group as a member.

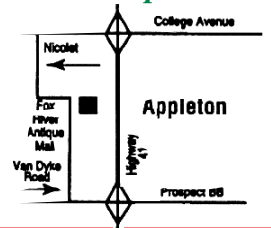
