



But stoneware is just a small fraction of what you'll find as you wander the aisles of the main floor of the building. Country store collectibles and American primitives are scattered everywhere, as is period advertising from automobile calendars to signs big and small.

Head downstairs and there's one room devoted to tools and petroliana, and another filled with vintage kitchenalia and cupboards. And be sure not to miss the brandnew 4000-square-foot addition adjacent to the original store! Choice porcelain, tin, and neon signs line the walls of the building, with an emphasis on high-end gas, brewery, and soda signs. And their wide assortment of antique furniture will appeal to all tastes. In stock during my visit: everything from a massive and

> heavily-carved Horner oak sideboard (that once graced the home of NFL great Michael Strahan) to

some nice country pieces including an exceptional figured maple buffet.

Can't make it to the shop? No worries, as Prock's Crocks and Antiques has a wonderful website, prockscrocksantiquestoneware.com, showcasing hundreds of instock antiques and collectibles separated by category. Featured items from a recent visit to the site included some rare soda fountain syrup dispensers, plus choice period signs from agricultural to petroleum. And the best part: Prock's Crocks and Antiques offers free shipping within the continental United States on most items!

A trip to Prock's Crocks and Antiques is a good excuse to visit the scenic Hayward Lakes Area of northwest Wisconsin. 





Dear Friends,

I am writing this letter with a heavy heart, my longtime employee and close family friend Doug Poffenberger has been suddenly stricken with a terminal form of a rare blood cancer (Multiple Myeloma, Stage 3). This disease has hit hard and fast and as in most cases it has been and will continue to be a huge financial burden on Doug and his family.

Doug and his family are facing a 250 mile round trip to the hospital per visit for 2 years while they fight this disease. They are telling Doug that he will be placed in the hospital for multiple visits of 6-15 days and at least 2 - 30 day visits for stem cell replacement. This means his wife, Heather will have huge costs in lodging and travel expenses as well as daily food expense on the road. At the same time Heather is losing most of her income while she travels with and spends time with her husband.

Doug is 41 years old and was just diagnosed with this disease; Doug and Heather have a 10 year old daughter, Emma and 2 boys Justin & Ian actively serving in our U.S. Military; Ashton a 13 year old stepson and Acelyn a 12 year old stepdaughter. Doug is a great guy with a good soul and a great attitude in life and has always been a hard worker and devoted to supporting his family by working hard for me daily so he could do just that.



## Why Join a Collecting Club?

If you pick up membership promotion brochures from clubs, or visit collecting club websites, you are confronted with all kinds of statements about why collectors should join this club or that one.

"A serious collector is an educated collector and you can become an educated collector by joining our club." "A great way to become `connected' for buying, selling or trading." "To meet other collectors and develop friendships which can last a lifetime." "To gain knowledge on values, reproductions and how to care for my collection."

These are all very valid reasons to join a collecting club... and, there are dozens more, we're sure. Some clubs do a tremendous job with membership services, offering newsletters and publications, mentoring programs, an educational website, annual convention, shows and auctions, price guides and research projects, resource libraries and archives, collector insurance programs, reproduction alerts, ethics guidelines for both collectors and dealers, member supply stores, annual membership collectors items and much more.

In reviewing what clubs offer and their various membership dues structures, it seems to us that membership in most clubs is a real bargain - a year's worth of service often for about the same price you would pay to go to a movie (with popcorn and drink), or a sports event or concert (and often a lot less).

Another factor to consider is that for most clubs we are talking about a one year commitment. Membership dues is usually for 12 months. At that time you can either renew for another year or decide not to.

Even for a person who is just beginning and maybe only mildly interested in a collecting area, what better way to determine if you want to become more serious in that collecting area than having a year's worth of member services from the club supporting that collecting area to help you "weigh your decision"?

For the collector who may possibly be interested in four or five different collecting areas, we would strongly suggest consider joining the clubs which support each of these four or five collecting areas. OK, so maybe you're not that much of a joiner. It still is the most practical way of letting the collecting club sell you on which area to eventually collect more seriously through the simple technique of camparison shopping. Let the clubs sell you on collecting in their area.

Another option, without the obligation of actively paying membership dues, is to simply ask a collecting club you may be interested in to send you some information on their club and the collecting area they support.

This is the main thrust of the Association of Collecting Clubs' Join A Club program - promoting the ACC Club Directory and the listings of over 6,000 collecting groups... probably some you've never heard of before, and how to contact them.

Now, getting back to the original question, "Why join a collecting club?" Probably the best answer is because YOU want to. It has to be your decision. Like your collection, itself, it's a personal thing. You decide what to collect... what to buy... how to display it... and everything else connected with your collecting. Joining, or not joining, a collecting club is a part of this. Most collecting clubs exist to support and help collectors, and perform a good service for their collecting area. But they also have the obligation of convincing you that you should join their group as a member.


