



### Three Days of Fun at August 16th -18th North Central **Sales Fischer Estate Auction**

Collectors Carl and Beverly Fischer moved to this central Wisconsin farm more than sixty years ago; and still own an antiques shop in nearby Rudolph. There was plenty of space for Carl's growing collection of old cars, which quickly started to fill the surrounding fields and woods. Fast forward to 2014, and with Carl's passing, the family decided it was time to call Duke & Kathy Packard of North Central Sales

"We spent several weeks on-site preparing for the auction" Kathy told me, "and ended up finding more than one-hundred & eighty cars and trucks on the property, plus dozens of tractors and other farm vehicles. Add to that the many buildings filled to the rafters with sixty years of collecting, and we knew it would take all of three days to sell it."

Saturday was day-one of the sale, concentrating on the farm machinery and primitives. Highlights ranged from an all-original Weber farm wagon that made \$1,475 to a rusty-but-ornate Crystal Peninsular cast iron stove that fetched \$400. I came for Sunday's auction, when the bulk of the cars and trucks were slated to sell along with hundreds of smaller collectibles.

I took quick look at the countless rusted vintage cars & trucks (and even a small fleet of school buses!) and thought that there may not be much value there. But I had forgotten how valuable old car parts have become. Auctioneer Duke Packard and crew spent the entire day traveling up & down the rows of cars, selling them as he went. A weathered 1947 Ford stake truck proved the winner of the bunch, bringing \$1,300. A 1949 Chevy dump truck that had lived on the farm nearly its whole life made \$900 - and a 1973 Buick Electra 225 did a bit better at \$950. And with many

of the hundred & eighty vehicles bringing \$500 or more, the dollars were quickly starting to add up.

Inside the giant big-top tent, Auctioneer Kathy Packard handled ring number-two, where all the furniture and smaller collectibles were sold. Prices were strong throughout the day. Two Motometer radiator caps, one a Ford, one a Chevy, sold as a pair for \$550. A vintage ladies dress form soon after surprised the crowd by bringing \$500. The two vintage jukeboxes found ready buyers too, with a 1939 Rock-Ola model making \$900 and a 1940s AMI "Mother of Plastic" juke bringing \$750. And those four "barn-find" Indian Premium Motorcycle Oil cans ended up as the top-lot under the tent, selling for a solid \$1,700.










The program has several aims. Some of these include:


- \* Antiques are Green aims to promote antiques as an alternative form of recycling and conserving natural resources.

- \* The Windsor Chair As described on the "Antiques are Green" website, the best way to illustrate why antiques are green is by an example (this can be applied to many different antiques) the humble Windsor chair. The chair parts were made by

craftsmen who lived in the woods where the materials came from. The turnings were produced on treadle-operated lathes, then parts were taken on foot to a local workshop to be assembled. From there the completed chairs would be distributed around the country by horse and cart or waterways. The chair saw hard use but is still around today. What a green product and what a life cycle! By buying this chair to use again we have conserved our natural resources and prevented the carbon footprint of another chair being produced, that possibly would come all the way from the Far East. I expect that a new mass produced chair will hit the waste dump long before the antique Windsor chair is sold again at auction, goes to the restorers to be revived and is retailed again for another 40 years use!

- \* By buying antiques and collectibles... and putting them into use, rather than buying a new product, is what "Antiques are Green" is all about. What a wonderful way for collecting clubs, for antique malls, flea markets, shows and auction houses to promote "going green" to younger consumers and buyers. This is another approach for reaching out to the young audience of 20-35 and showing how antiques can be an integral part of their lives while helping the environment all at the same time.
- \* Finding antiques and decorative objects to decorate your living space or work place is a great way to personalize your home or office and make it uniquely yours. Furnishing or redecorating your first apartment or home with old objectives makes economic sense, as well as "green sense."
- \* Vintage clothing... and clothing accessories are currently hot among young adults. We're talking buttons, fabric, jewelry, hats either to wear or as decoration. Old advertising items and other graphic arts, movie posters and political posters, kitchen items, pottery and glassware, toys, music-related items, old record players and radios, old bottles, even vintage automobiles... the listing is endless, but can all tie in to the Green about Antiques concept. It provides a great way for a lot of collecting clubs to reach out to young adults by encouraging their interest in collecting in one or more of these areas by promoting the "eco-friendly" approach. 
