



Interesting Mix at September 13th Bill Cain Auction In Sheboygan, Wisconsin

If you're an auction addict like me, you probably know Bill Cain as one of the area's most experienced auctioneers. His auction schedule on any given week might include everything from high-end real estate to auctioning off prize-winning animals at the County Fair. What you might not know is that Bill Cain Re/Max Realty is also one of Wisconsin's top real estate firms. They're among the top-selling Re/Max teams in the state, and were named one of America's top-100 realtors by Real Estate Today. The Cain family remains committed to the auction business too, with Bill's son Nick now calling bids at most of their sales.

A chilly late summer Saturday morning didn't deter the bidders from coming to the on-site Sheboygan auction, and sunny skies quickly warmed the crowd by the 9:00 am start of the sale. Two rings ran throughout the day, with ring #1 selling the furniture and household goods, and ring #2 circling the farmstead - taking care of the tools, farm equipment, and primitives.

That circa-1980 John Deere 3030 ended up as the top-lot of the auction, rolling off for a respectable \$5,000. Other farm & lawn highlights: a nearly-new John Deere D130 riding mower that made \$1,200, and a clean wooden-wheeled antique grain wagon that fetched an even \$1,000.

An interesting mix of furniture from antique to Mid Century Modern found ready buyers back in ring #1, with a curved glass oak china cabinet the winner at \$300. Jewelry buyers has much to choose from too, with an 1887 Liberty Gold Eagle coin necklace fetching \$1,100, and a 14k & diamond men's gold ring right behind at \$1,025.

Many in the crowd came for that unusual jukebox still sitting in the home's basement: a 1941 Seeburg Model RC-9800 Hi Tone Deluxe Symphonola, selling complete with its Seeburg Speakorgan Wall-O-Matic Remote Speaker. I'd never seen the model in person before, best described as a round Art Deco tower with another smaller tower sprouting from the top. Within five years, Seeburg whacked that smaller tower off, resulting in the firm's popular "Trash Can" series of jukeboxes they produced until their revolutionary Selectomatic model was introduced. In fair unrestored condition, it sold to a happy local buyer for \$2,100.



A Major Step In Fighting Fraud In The Antiques Business

History has been made! The Federal Trade Commission and the Professional Show Managers Association (PSMA) have jointly taken a giant step in educating the public about fraud in the world of antiques and collectibles and the Wisconsin Antique Dealers Association, dedicated to honesty and authenticity in the trade of antiques, has joined the effort!

A yearlong crusade, led by Nancy Johnson and Dordy Fontinel, board members of the Professional Show Managers Association, has resulted in the printing and mass distribution of hundreds of thousands of colorful informative bookmarks. Titled "Antiques, How to Shop Wisely", the educational pieces give bullet points of information to be considered when shopping for antiques.

"When shopping for antiques and collectibles, ask the dealer. How long have you been in business? How do you know any item is genuine, not a fake or reproduction? What are your criteria for identifying the item? Will you give me a written guarantee that the item is authentic? What is your return policy?"

In addition, Johnson and Fontinel were successful in their request that Consumer Information on Safely Shopping for Antiques and Collectibles be added to the FTC website. The two women spent nearly six months working with the FTC on the specific information that is now available. The recently posted article may be accessed by visiting the FTC.gov website or simply googling FTC antiques.

When PSMA President Nancy Johnson wrote an article in the Association's Winter 2007 newsletter entitled "When Did It Become OK To Cheat Someone?", a commentary on our world's complacency about being defrauded, show promoter Dordy Fontinel responded and began a dialogue with Johnson about the problem of fakes and fraud in the world of antiques and collectibles. This dialogue resulted in Fontinel speaking with Sen. John Warner, subsequent meetings with his staff and the Federal Trade Commission.

Last June, Fontinel and Johnson met with Jeanne Bumpus, Director of Congressional Affairs at the FTC, and members of the planning and information division of the FTC. Their goal was to have Antiques & Collectibles recognized as "consumer items" and to encourage the FTC to take note of the rampant fraud, which is taking place under the guise of "Antiques". The FTC agreed and the process began. Knowingly selling a fake is criminal fraud in most states.

PSMA also feels that the bookmarks will provide a convenient opportunity for anyone interested in educating the buying public and fighting the cause. PSMA encourages show promoters, dealers, shop and mall managers, club members, and auctioneers to get involved, therefore PSMA is offering the bookmarks at their cost.

The battle has just begun! Now that the FTC has issued an Alert that selling an antique or collectible item that is not authentic is Fraud, Fontinel and Johnson feel more consumer protection will occur on the state and local level. Such fraud can be reported directly on the Federal Trade Commission site at: http://www.ftc.gov/bcp/index.shtml . Choose the tab "File A Complaint."

These informative bookmarks are given to attendees of the Wisconsin Antique Dealers Association shows held in Waukesha each October & February.

70 Gallon Jug Brings \$17,000 at Red Wing Collectors Society **Convention Auction**

Much to the enjoyment of more than 400 attendees, the RWCS Foundation proudly opened the doors to the new Pottery Museum on Wednesday, July 9 during a ribbon-cutting ceremony and fundraising event. The 13,000 sq. ft. facility, which is located in the Pottery Place Annex building at 240 Harrison St. in Red Wing, has more than 6,000 pieces of Red Wing stoneware and pottery on display - largely in thanks to the donation of longtime RWCS member Louise Schleich and her late husband, Jerry. The couple created a museum to display their collection in Lincoln, Neb. many years ago, but it was always their intention to move the collection to Red Wing once a permanent, adequately sized location could be acquired.

The 38th Annual RWCS Convention officially kicked off the next day, with the Schleich Family presenting the keynote address at Red Wing High School. They discussed their longtime passion for collecting and the process of moving the collection back to where it was made.

This year's Convention brought nearly 1,500 visitors to the city of Red Wing during the week of July 7 to buy, sell and learn more about the many lines of Red Wing stoneware, art pottery and dinnerware.

This year's event was sponsored by Red Wing Stoneware, Red Wing Pottery, Larry's Jugs Antiques and other local businesses.


Events throughout the week included the annual business meeting, a "Crock Hunt" scavenger hunt around the historic Mississippi River town, and the always anticipated Saturday Show & Sale. There was also a special display room at Red Wing High School, where members created their own unique displays for the education and enjoyment of attendees, combined with some fun and creative competition. Members bought and sold items throughout the week in the parking lot at Pottery Place Mall. About 200 volunteers helped make this year's Convention a success.

As mentioned earlier, the "big" news from the always anticipated RWCS Convention Auction was that a 70 gallon shoulder jug sold for \$17,000. The jug, which had been restored, is one of only three that the Red Wing Stoneware Co. made for the 1923 Minnesota State Fair. Only one other of these jugs is known to have survived, and it is now part of the Pottery Museum's collection; it was one of the pieces donated by the Schleich Family.

Other items of interest in this year's July 10 auction, which was operated by Houghton's Auction Service, included a 4 gallon salt glaze crock with triple target decoration (hairline), \$5,000; a 4 gallon North Star salt glaze water great buy at \$400. cooler with upturned leaf (mint), \$2,000 and a mint "Minne-ha-ha Brand" advertising crock, \$1,900; Two 1977 (first-year) RWCS Commemoratives sold for Collectors. \$1,150 and \$1,050, respectively.

Notable art pottery items included a blue/green #687 Chromoline vase that sold for \$650, and an M3016 Decorator Line vase in silver green glaze for \$400. Top dinnerware lots included two sample Red Wing dinnerware plates. One that was likely made for Sheraton Hotels in the 1960s sold for \$525, while another with the Turtle Dove pattern in blue and green sold for \$340. The auction, which consisted of about 190 items, brought in nearly \$78,000 in total sales.

The year's commemorative, which could be purchased only by RWCS members, was a Red Wing Success Filter. Two limited-edition commemoratives were also produced. These were mixed in with the regular commemoratives and all commemoratives were packaged in sealed boxes, so a small number of members were fortunate enough to get one. Of all the Commemorative Success Filters that were made, 90 percent were zinc glaze with a red wing, 9 percent were salt glaze and 38 were bluesponged. RWCS Commemorative Manager Bob Morawski also had several special items made that were auctioned off to benefit the Society.

Another unique aspect of the RWCS Convention was the participation of the younger generation through the KidsView program. The Society is on the leading edge of creating engaging and educational ways to get the younger generations involved in collecting. The focus on these RWCS members is an

important part of the vision of the Society to ensure its continued existence and growth. Many interactive and challenging activities and seminars were offered for children of all ages. Former Red Wing Potteries employee Marion Bjorklund told the kids about her time working as a plate painter, and Emily Nelson (Red Wing Art Reach) and Susan Obermeyer (Northern Clay Center) lead the kids in hands-on art projects and pottery creations.




