Twenty-Two Years & Growing at the Dodgeville Lions Club Antique Sale & Flea Market

Dodgeville, Wisconsin. It's a town that means different things to different people. History buffs know it as one of the Badger State's oldest European settlements, founded in 1829. Surprisingly, at one time it was also the largest city in Wisconsinwith a population then greater than Milwaukee's and Chicago's combined. And historical sites are all around it too, including the nearby Pendarvis State Historical Site in Mineral Point among many others.

Outdoor enthusiasts know it as the gateway to the many natural attractions in the State's famed driftless region, from Governor Dodge State Park to the scenic Wisconsin River Valley. The outdoor fun continues all winter at the region's popular ski & snowboard resort, Tyrol Basin.

And many vacationers know it as a convenient base for visiting the numerous nearby manmade attractions. Notable destinations include everything from the famed House on the Rock to Frank Lloyd Wright's Taliesin to kids' favorites like Cave of the Mounds and Circus World Museum.

And for the past twenty-two years, Dodgeville has also played host to what has become one of the best antique & flea markets in southwest Wisconsin: the Dodgeville Lions Club Antique Sale & Flea Market.

Held twice each year, in June and again in August, the one-day sale fills Harris Park's Ley Pavilion with sixty dealers and attracts hundreds of shoppers. It's an easy

and scenic drive from almost anywhere too - only an hour west of Madison, two hours from Milwaukee, or three from Chicago. And as it's a Dodgeville Lions Club organized event, all the proceeds from the show help fund projects right in the community.

The exhibitors range from locals selling family treasures to quality antiques dealers from both near & far. Some have been coming for most or all of the shows twodecade history, like local collectors Marion & Jack Reynolds. They always have one of the biggest displays at the show, their booth brimming with local finds from steamer trunks to some choice early agricultural implements.

The country theme continued in Dixie & Ken Delkamp's display, where I found primitives including a nice saddle maker's bench and a rustic yarn winder. No matter what your interests, you'll probably find it here, from The Green Knight's excellent collection of vintage military memorabilia to the countless vintage tools at Carriage House Woodworks.

Why not plan to visit the Dodgeville Lions Club Antique Sale & Flea Market in 2015, for either the June or August shows – or maybe both! There's lots more to do in the area too: just visit www.dodgeville.com for the lowdown on what the region has to offer. 











Where can I get more information? etc.

By spending only a couple of minutes on the site, if a visitor has an interest in collecting or studying golf memorabilia, it would be hard to resist joining!


