Victorian Splendor the Focus at Huge Auction Specialists Living Estate Sale

Jim Seamonson, owner of Auction Specialists Stoughton, is having another very busy summer, with often two exceptional auctions each week. Take, for example, the recent auction for collectors Sam & Ruth Sloan he recently held in Stoughton, Wisconsin. At the July 24th sale, a big crowd turned out for the chance to bid on items from the Sloan's vast collection of 19th century furnishings. Highlights were many at the huge offering, from a walnut cylinder secretary & bookcase that made \$875 to an early Red Wing double birch leaf 15-gallon crock that soared to \$1,500!

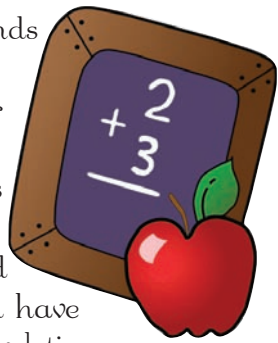

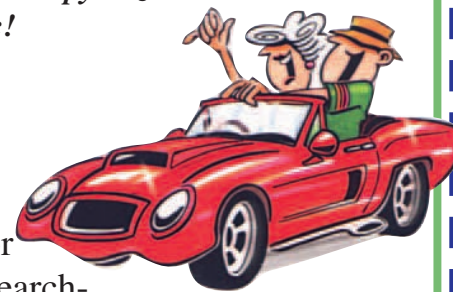

Lighting, Furniture, and Much More at Auction Specialists Living Estate Auction in Stoughton, Wisconsin

The Sloans have been passionate collectors for decades, filling their historic Victorian-era Stoughton home with the best in period furnishings. A recent move to a condo meant a downsizing was in order though, so they gave Jim Seamonson of Auction Specialists Stoughton a call. And I don't think any of the hundred-plus bidders that turned out for the sale were anything but impressed with the quality, and sheer quantity, of the offerings. The sale was moved to the nearby Mandt Community Center, a large climate-controlled facility that was much appreciated on this steamy July day.

Auctioneer Don Kleven, Jr. began the sale with the smaller household goods, then quickly moved on to the period lighting and furniture. I counted nearly two-dozen leaded glass lamps among the offerings. Most were unmarked, but a few by makers such as Bradley & Hubbard were among the mix, and sold for up to \$450 each.

The furniture found ready buyers too. Best by far: that late 19th century cylinder front walnut secretary & bookcase that made a solid \$875. 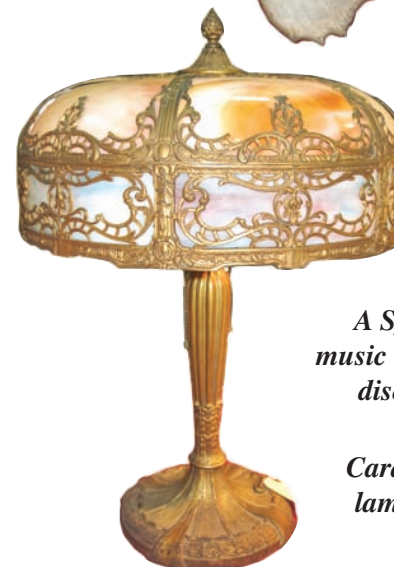

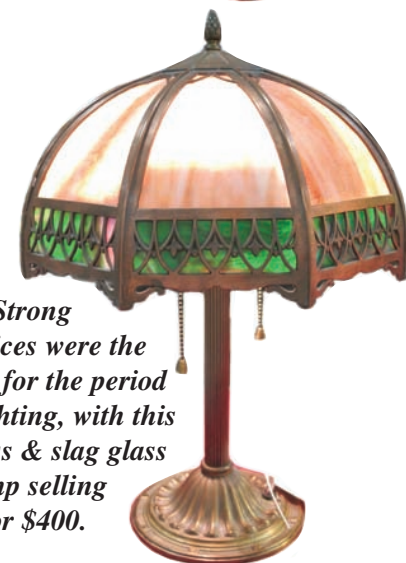

MANGLE BOARDS DISENTANGLED

*Barnes Foundation Alumnus Opens Window
into Hidden World of Folk Art Treasures
with Mangle Boards of Northern Europe*



Luxury Coffee Table Book Sets Standard as Definitive Resource

PHILADELPHIA (May 19, 2015) – If you already know what a mangle board is and how to judge its origins, then consider yourself among the lucky few.

For the time being.

That small group is due to quickly expand with the release this month of a prodigious book on the “arcane charms” (New York Times) of these folk art treasures, **MANGLE BOARDS OF NORTHERN EUROPE: A Definitive Guide to the Geographic Origins of Mangle Boards** (Streamline Press) - a luxurious, eight-pound coffee table book by art historian and Barnes Foundation alumnus Jay Raymond.

Raymond writes that a mangle board is a carved plank of wood used in conjunction with a wooden rolling pin to smooth wrinkles from linen. With animal-shaped handles and knobs, mangle boards span a 300-year period beginning in the mid-1500s and peaking during the mid 18th century, utilized in nearly a dozen European countries. “They are the result of skilled and unskilled craft. They are folk art. They use symbolism. The design motifs are drawn from antiquity onward and from regions inside and outside Europe.” When mass-produced, heatable sadirons came into vogue in the 19th century, mangle boards were soon forgotten and on track to becoming the rare works of art they are today.

With photographs of 267 mangle boards thoughtfully positioned across 288 folio sized pages, **MANGLE BOARDS OF NORTHERN EUROPE** is designed to illuminate the handiwork of countless hands, many of them made by common people, whose lives are otherwise lost to history.

“Most books about collections don’t have the visual presence this book has,” says Raymond. “They haven’t spent the time and resources on photography and production, and tend to describe the history, instead of the objects. That’s the strength of this book. For the reader it illuminates the objects and educates the eye.”

The story behind **MANGLE BOARDS OF NORTHERN EUROPE** is as curious as the topic at hand. Raymond, a collector himself of vintage electric clothes irons, was summoned on a six-year adventure by William C. Carson, a prolific collector of mangle boards, to create this unprecedented window into a heretofore unsung world – an exquisite volume of extraordinary magnitude. Carson found Raymond teaching

at the world famous Barnes Foundation in Philadelphia, whose mission since its founding in 1922 has been “the promotion of the advancement of education and the appreciation of the fine arts.” Raymond, originally a student at the Barnes Foundation, had already written a book on vintage electric irons, *Streamlined Irons*, in 2008, so linkage to their northern European ancestors – mangle boards – was clear.

“He wanted there to be an expert to write this book, so I became an expert,” says Raymond, also editor of *Pressing News*, a publication of the Pressing Iron and Trivet Collectors of America. “I saw this as a challenge. I knew very little about mangle boards, but Mr. Carson sensed that, with the resources, I had the skills to gain a deep understanding of them. And that’s what he provided. He permitted me enough time and resources to travel to seven countries and 17 museums, to photograph, study, and write about the boards.”

Raymond’s journey took him to the Netherlands, Denmark, Finland, Sweden, Iceland, Norway and Germany, where he saw seven thousand mangle boards –which can range in value from \$300 to \$12,000. Raymond’s objective was to recognize the common characteristics of the mangle boards of each country.

Raymond’s judgment grew such that he was able to direct his proficiency toward Carson’s personal collection – and somewhat uncomfortably, straighten out the man who’d hired him – and judge the authenticity of his collection of mangle boards.

“I came to the conclusion that many of his boards were not authentic,” Raymond acknowledges. “I removed more than half of his collection over a six-month period. It was very difficult to tell him. I removed 30, then another 30, then 70 others – 130 boards removed overall, more than half of his collection. I now have confidence in my judgment, but that took a while. The whole experience was quite an education.”

Jay Raymond graduated from Temple University with a degree in art. He also studied at the Barnes Foundation in Merion, Pa., then taught in the art department there. He appeared in the documentary film *The Art of the Steal*, which examines the figures and forces behind the relocation, disfigurement, and commercialization of the art collection at the Barnes Foundation. Raymond is editor of *Pressing News*, a publication of the Pressing Iron and Trivet Collectors of America. His first book, *Streamlined Irons*, was published in 2008. His work life also has encompassed the jobs of heating mechanic and contractor, building inspector, handyman, and maître d’ of a vegan restaurant. He and his partner, Catherine Suttle, live in Frenchtown, New Jersey.

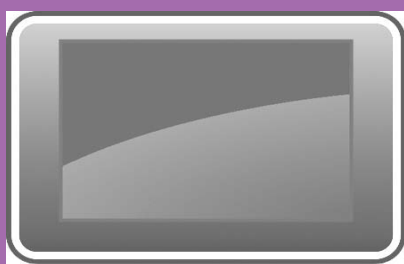

Antiques are Green Campaign: Good Tie-In for Many Collecting Clubs



National Antique Week is promoted and celebrated in Great Britain during the week of November 23-30, 2009. This week long event with the theme Antiques are Green comes at a pivotal time for the antiques trade when public and media interest is heightened by campaigns such as "Antiques are Green" spearheaded by Nigel Worboys and the petition on "Antiques" designed to persuade the British government to provide more support to the Fine Art and Antiques industry.

The program has several aims. Some of these include:

* Antiques are Green aims to promote antiques as an alternative form of recycling and conserving natural resources.

* Antiques are Green aims to encourage existing consumers and attract a new audience who may not have considered buying antiques before.

* Antiques are Green aims to encourage businesses and consumers on reducing their carbon footprint, dependency on fossil fuel and becoming greener.

* By purchasing, conserving or selling antiques you contribute to these aims. By signing up for "Antiques are Green" you become part of this vision. There is no cost for signing up.

* The Windsor Chair - As described on the "Antiques are Green" website, the best way to illustrate why antiques are green is by an example (this can be applied to many different antiques) the humble Windsor chair. The chair parts were made by

craftsmen who lived in the woods where the materials came from. The turnings were produced on treadle-operated lathes, then parts were taken on foot to a local workshop to be assembled. From there the completed chairs would be distributed around the country by horse and cart or waterways. The chair saw hard use but is still around today. What a green product and what a life cycle! By buying this chair to use again we have conserved our natural resources and prevented the carbon footprint of another chair being produced, that possibly would come all the way from the Far East. I expect that a new mass produced chair will hit the waste dump long before the antique Windsor chair is sold again at auction, goes to the restorers to be revived and is retailed again for another 40 years use!

* By buying antiques and collectibles... and putting them into use, rather than buying a new product, is what "Antiques are Green" is all about. What a wonderful way for collecting clubs, for antique malls, flea markets, shows and auction houses to promote "going green" to younger consumers and buyers. This is another approach for reaching out to the young audience of 20-35 and showing how antiques can be an integral part of their lives while helping the environment all at the same time.
